You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Literary Studies Experience.

**Additional Notes:**

The art history program of study is flexible as long as the prerequisites are followed.

The program is comprised of:

- 6-12 hours of foreign language
- 46 hours in the major, including 6 hours of studio courses, 7 hours of related areas and 33 hours of art history courses
- 2 hours of electives outside the department, and
- A minor comprising of 12-24 hours

Students should check with the relevant department in which they wish to pursue their minor for the required number of hours. Commonly pursued minors by art history students include English, Women’s Studies, General Business, History, Anthropology, and Philosophy.



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Students are advised to take the introductory courses as well as the two art history surveys early in their programs.

Although this is not guaranteed, introductory and advanced art history courses are often offered during the summer.
