Additional Notes:

The BA in Interdisciplinary Art program of study is flexible as long as the prerequisites are followed.

The program is comprised of:

- Complete the 46 credit hours for the major
- Complete 18 credit hours at Appalachian State University
- Earn a minimum grade of C or 2.0 in each Art Course
- Fulfill the Junior Writing in the Discipline (WID) and the Senior Capstone Experience (CAP) requirements
- Complete 6 to 12 hours of a foreign language, and
- Complete a 12 to 24 credit hour minor in a discipline outside the visual arts

Students should check with the relevant department in which they wish to pursue their minor for the required number of hours. Commonly pursued minors by art history students include English, Women’s Studies, General Business, History, Anthropology, and Philosophy.



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Students are advised to complete the foundation and survey of art history classes early in their programs. The Portfolio Review is required early in the sequence to assure graduation in four years. Students are encouraged to seek individual advising from their advisor at any time. Students can satisfy some of their studio art and art history requirements over the summer.
