Additional Notes:

- Residency Requirements:
 - 30 hours must be from ASU (25% of the credit hours required for the degree).
 - 21 hours in the major must be from ASU.
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU.
- Adjustments to this four-year plan can be made based on transfer and AP credits.
- GCM 3900 should be taken as a Summer internship between the junior and senior years.
- GCM 4900 should be taken as a Summer internship after completion of senior year coursework.
