- <u>Second Academic Concentration (SAC)</u> **should be chosen as soon as possible** to avoid sequencing problems (prerequisites, etc.) and ensure timely completion. Consult the <u>University Bulletin</u> for course prerequisites.
- Nine (9) hours of SAC can be double-counted between General Education and major.
- Service-learning or Community Service experiences are required in Directed Elective, CI/SPE 3300, and CI 3110.
- ALL non-block coursework should be completed before 6th semester.
- A student must have at least a 2.70 grade-point average to be admitted to the teacher education program and must maintain a 2.70 grade-point average overall through student teaching.
