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**Additional Notes:**

- **Student should refer to the Major POS and the General Education POS for more information and prerequisites.**
- Official Common Core Tests (PRAXIS) scores must be in Banner before early registration window closes for fall and Spring semesters.
- **Second Academic Concentration (SAC) should be chosen as soon as possible** to avoid sequencing problems (prerequisites, etc.) and ensure timely completion. Consult the *University Bulletin* for course prerequisites.
- Up to nine (9) hours of SAC can be double-counted between General Education and major.
- PSY 3010 is 3 sh requirement in Liberal Studies Experience (LSE).
- Service-learning or Community Service experiences are required in Directed Elective, CI/SPE 3300, and CI 3110.
- ALL non-block coursework should be completed before 6<sup>th</sup> semester.
- **A student must have at least a 2.70 grade-point average to be admitted to the teacher education program and must maintain a 2.70 grade-point average overall through student teaching.**
