- Up to 9 hours of major coursework, including SOC 1000, may be used to meet both major and Gen Ed requirements. If courses used to fulfill the major are also used to meet a Gen Ed Perspective theme course, replace one “Gen Ed Perspective” with Free Elective for each double counted course.
- Sociology electives and concentration courses should be chosen in consultation with the student’s Sociology advisor.
- All students must have an Internship Proposal approved by the Internship Proposal Committee the semester (fall, spring) prior to enrolling in their Internship (SOC 4900).
- Residency Requirements:
 - 31 hours must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
